Bracken as habitat

As surrogate woodland:

- Ground flora
- Tree regeneration


For invertebrates

Over 40 species of herbivorous invertebrates:

- 11 limited to bracken
- 14 also use other ferns

Fritillaries:

- Pearl-bordered
- Small pearl-bordered
- Dark green

For vertebrates:

Birds – including whinchat, nightjar

Reptiles – adder, lizards
