The conversion of a traditional 'L' shaped steading into a practical family home has been undertaken by the owners of the building themselves, Paddy and Maureen Smyth. The original steading has been sensitively renovated, and a new wing added to create the new 'T' shaped form. The quality of the workmanship seen in this project is excellent, with the handmade timber cabinets in the main living room a highlight.

Making the best use of what was already on site

The renovation of the original steading was helped by the decision to insert a new timber frame within the original granite walls. This provides support for the new roof, and also meant a considerable amount of insulation could be incorporated into the development.

Form of development

The addition of a new wing to the steading to create a 'T' shaped structure has meant the original single storey form of the steading has been retained, but additional living space has also been provided to enable the building to function well as a family home.
