I have had a look at the proposed settlement boundary for Insh from the national park authority. I would like to propose a boundary change to include land which we own to the north and west west of Insh which is within the Insh village boundary. We have a small pocket of land which adjoins our property at the moment to the west of the Schoolhouse. Whilst we have no intentions of developing this land at present, it may be as we get older and less able this site could be of use for a small, energy efficient house on one level which would allow us to remain in our village. Really we would like to 'futureproof' this area should we be forced to leave our present house due to age or infirmity. I would be happy to meet to discuss this further if required.
