# Key work package 9 - Active Cairngorms

- Active Cairngorms Strategy The CNPA is now in the early stages of producing this updated strategic document and will, following the update given at this meeting, keep the LOAF informed of progress.
- 2. **Short Links Funding** Sustrans have granted £115,000 to CNPA as a contribution towards completion of parts of the Speyside Way extension. This support is dependent upon appropriate match funding being secured and will allow for completion of the work to a standard appropriate for bicycles.
- 3. **Community Path Leaflets –** A leaflet for Grantown on Spey has now been published as an addition to the existing series. The CNPA has also commenced a reprint of a number of these publications and they will continue to made available throughout the Park over the forthcoming summer season.

## Key work package 12 - Visitor and access infrastructure

- 4. Management of core paths and outdoor access:
  - a) Local path development The CNPA has completed an important addition to the network of easily accessible paths on the outskirts of Aviemore. Aviemore Community Park is a collaborative project with the Aviemore and Cambusmore Enhancement Co. and has been part funded by the CNPA. The project has been carried out in conjunction with the Spey Catchment Initiative.
  - b) **Path Signs** New signs are now in place on the Aviemore path network and similar ones will shortly be installed in Grantown in conjunction with Anagach Woods Trust and the Community Council.
  - c) **Speyside Way extension** Planning permission has now been secured and work on two sections of the extension will begin shortly.
  - d) **Deeside Way extension** an options appraisal has been carried out to determine the viability of an extension. Options will be discussed with key stakeholders. Any extension is a long term aspiration.
  - e) **Upholding Access Rights** access casework continues to be reported and dealt with according to protocols. An update will be presented under Agenda Item 7.

## **Other National Park Initiatives**

5. **Capercaillie Framework** - The CNPA is continues with preparation of this document in response to the continued threat to this iconic Scottish species. It will include an examination of disturbance arising from recreational use of bird habitat. An update will be presented under Agenda Item 8.
