
Proposal: Sub-division of feu and erection of boundary fence



- Planning permission is sought for the sub-division of a feu and the erection of a boundary fence in the existing garden ground of Mar Cottage on Chapel Brae in Braemar. The garden ground overlooks the Games Field;
- The proposed sub divided area is on land at the end of the rear garden. A laneway runs adjacent to the western boundary and would provide direct vehicular access to the sub division;
- An adequate area of rear garden ground would also be maintained to serve the existing main dwelling house on Chapel Brae;
- The proposed sub division would result in the existing bothy type structure being sited on an independent feu;
- As a proposal for a sub division within the settlement area of Braemar, the application is not considered to raise issues of significance to the aims of the National Park.











Proposal: Erection of machinery shed (Agricultural and Forestry Notification)




- This is an Agricultural Notification for the erection of a machinery shed;
- •The proposed structure would be of a standard agricultural nature, with the walls and roof proposed to be clad in sheeted steel;
- The machinery shed is proposed within the existing farm complex, where a number of agricultural buildings already exist;
- As an Agricultural Notification the CNPA does not have any statutory call in powers, and in addition the development is not considered to raise issues of significance to the aims of the National Park.



- An adequate area of garden ground would remain to serve the existing dwelling house;
- The size and configuration of the proposed new site is consistent with the general pattern of development in the vicinity;
- The proposal is an infill development in an established residential area within the settlement of Grantown on Spey. As a proposal for a single dwelling house it is not considered to raise issues of significance to the aims of the National Park.
