Proposed Local Development Plan – Action Programme

I. Introduction

1.1 This Proposed Action Programme has been prepared to support delivery of the Cairngorms National Park Local Development Plan. It identifies the actions which will help implement the vision, strategy and proposals of the Plan, and will serve as a delivery tool in achieving this purpose.

1.2 This Action Programme sets out how the Cairngorms National Park Authority (CNPA), constituent local authorities and other partners intend to implement the Cairngorms Nation Park Local Development Plan (LDP).

1.3 This document accompanies the LDP and identifies its vision, spatial strategy and its policies and proposals

The Action Programme sets out, where possible:

- A list of actions required to deliver each of the Plan's key policies and proposals;
- The name of the person/organisation who is to carry out the action; and
- The broad timescale for carrying out each action.

1.4 The Town and Country Planning (Development Planning) (Scotland) Regulations 2008 does not specify the particular types of action that should be included, though these may be expected to include the delivery of key infrastructure and the preparation of supplementary guidance. The actions set out within the Action Programme are not limited to those expected of the CNPA or the local authorities.

1.5 This Action Programme is intended to be a 'live' document which can be periodically reviewed and updated to reflect progress

with its proposals. It is expected that more detail will be added as we move forward and as new actions are identified. It will be formally re-published at least every two years, as required by planning regulations.

1.6 This Action Programme has three main sections:

Section I: Land Allocations

Section 2: Infrastructure Delivery

Section 3: Delivery of LDP objectives

1.7 In future reviews we may also include an outline of the need and timeline for the preparation of other policy guidance or documents which come about as a result of monitoring. This may include actions relating to supplementary guidance and any other non-statutory planning advice. However, at present the Plan is supported by a full suite of supplementary guidance to allow its implementation and delivery.

2. Review – next steps

2.1 The CNPA recognise that implementing the Plan requires working with its partners and stakeholders. Engagement with the development industry is a key part of the action programming process, ensuring that all parties are signed up to the identified actions and that timescales are practical and achievable. The CNPA will liaise with developers to discuss the proposed delivery and phasing of sites, provision of infrastructure and any potential issues. Discussions with key agencies, other partners and stakeholders will also take place to provide a realistic framework for the delivery of development.
