1. Executive Summary

This is the first Annual Report for Cairngorms LEADER Programme. The figures contained within this report are cumulative, providing the reader with a snapshot of the programme to date. We continue to receive enquiries and expressions of interests for LEADER funding without the requirement of animation from the team. The programme appears to have an excellent momentum at present, with a consistent inflow of enquiries, expressions of interest, and applications, which should carry the programme forward until our allocation is fully committed.

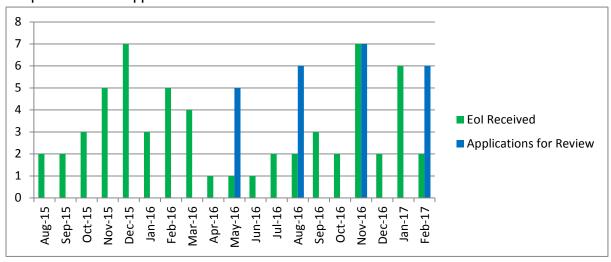






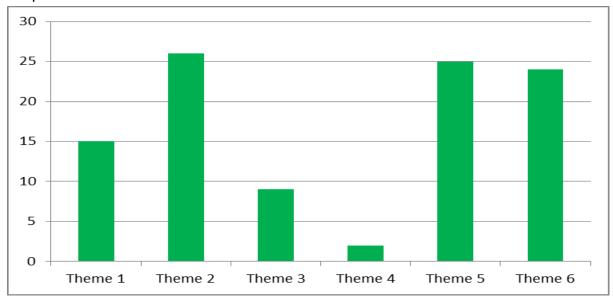
ii) Approved EoI Analysis (including applications)

Graph I – Eols & Application/Month



The green columns indicate a consistent inflow of expressions of interest to date, with blue columns indicating a consistent conversion of 5 to 7 expressions of interest to full application during each LAG cycle over the last year.

Graph 2 - Eols/Themes









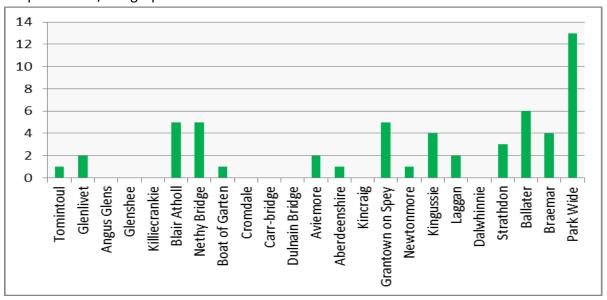






Themes 1, 2, 5, and 6 are well represented in expressions of interest received to date however there remains a gap in the number of projects addressing theme 4, and to a lesser extent, theme 3.

Graph 3 - EoIs/Geographical area



There are a higher number of expressions of interest aiming to deliver projects park wide than any one geographical area. This represents a relatively even distribution across the park with Ballater, Grantown-on-Spey, Nethy Bridge, and Blair Atholl the focus of the most proposals to date. We are yet to receive expressions of interest that focus on the following geographical areas of; Angus Glens, Glenshee, Killicrankie, Cromdale, Carrbridge, Dulnain Bridge, Kincraig or Dalwhinnie.



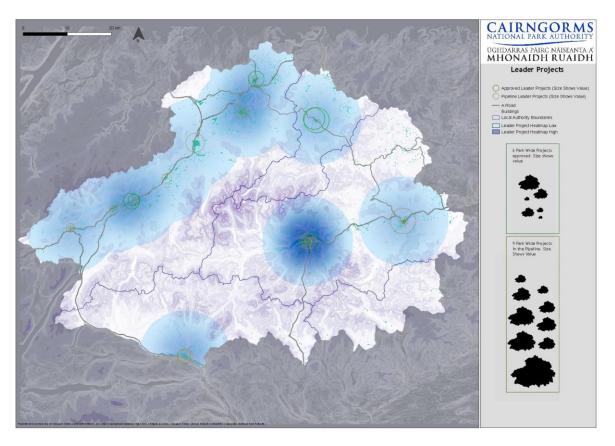












The heat map above demonstrates a clear spread of interest in the Cairngorms LEADER programme throughout the national park, with a high concentration particularly in the Braemar area, and a consistent level of interest down the A9 corridor. Approved projects are represented by green circles, and proposals in the pipeline are represented by yellow circles. The size variance in the coloured circles indicate value, with larger values represented by larger circles. Ballater, for example, shows a low number of proposals however the value of approved projects is high.





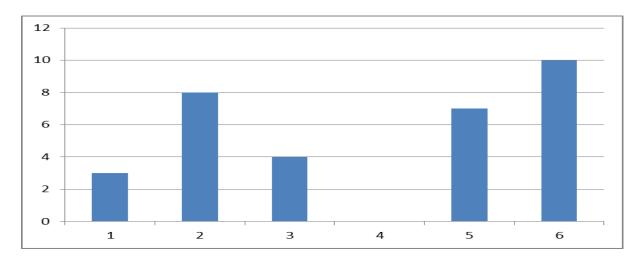






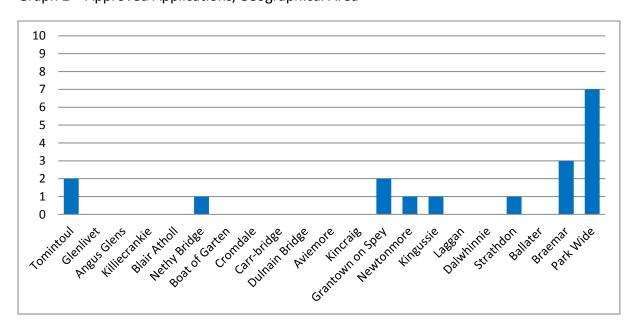


Graph 1 - Applications/Themes

Graph 2 – Approved Applications/Geographical Area



Geographical areas that have benefited from approved applications are Tomintoul, Nethy Bridge, Grantown-on-Spey, Newtonmore, Kingussie, Strathdon, and Braemar, with seven approved projects being delivered across the National Park.

The total eligible project cost for all projects included for LAG consideration at the time of the February 2017 LAG meeting is £2,144,137.87, with a total LEADER commitment of £1,103,123.67, giving a current programme intervention rate of 51.4% for approved projects. This also equates to a current leverage of £1.04 million in third party contributions to LEADER projects in the Cairngorms (94.4% of LEADER investment). This excludes "non-eligible" project finance, such as existing staff time and organisational resources committed by organisations to project delivery. The additional ask of projects coming forward for decision at the February LAG has a total LEADER intervention of £600,598.34 of project costs totalling £896,416.97.

The average project cost is £142,942.52 with an average LEADER intervention of £73,541.59 at an average rate of 70%. Comparatively, the average total cost for projects coming forward for decision at the February LAG is £179,283.39, with an average LEADER intervention ask of £120,120 at an average rate of 77.9%.

3. Finance

Cairngorms LEADER has made commitments to 16 projects however 1 has been withdrawn. Approved projects are now beginning to make claims with three submitted, and 2 approved, so far. The expectation is that, change requests to milestones notwithstanding, the number of claims received for approved projects will begin to steadily increase throughout the next year as the number of new enquiries naturally decreases.

LEADER Pipeline

The Cairngorms LEADER total project allocation is currently 49% subscribed with approved project commitment total £1,101,736.64 from a total project allocation of £2,226,388. Regarding applications coming forward for decision at the February LAG meeting, the aggregate request from LEADER is £600,598.34, which, if approved without adjustment would bring the total commitment to £1,702,334.98, representing an 76% commitment of our total project allocation. With further consideration to expressions of interest presented for preliminary discussion at the February LAG, with an aggregate request of £998,252, the programme could potentially be fully committed by summer 2017.
