


The playing field regularly becomes water logged. Sewers have backed up and flooded the playing areas resulting in a very significant Health and Safety risk and in school closures.


We believe that the current facilities are woefully inadequate, potentially dangerous and are unable to meet the demands of the ever growing population of Aviemore.

I am writing to you after attending a meeting with the planners of the new community school in Avienore primary school last night. I have some concerns with the revised plans for the school.

- 1. I live in Birch road behind the British legion, the revised plans have brought the car parking along past my back garden with the road up against my back fence. We have some broom and shrubs grow at the back fence just now that help absorb the noise from the British legion which affects our bedroom windows, this will all be taken away, plus we will have the traffic at our back garden. Our house was built with the bedroom windows to the rear because there was less noise impact this will no longer be the case. We also worry that if more parking is needed they will extend further into our street.
- 2. The other issue brought up at the meeting is the possibility of raising the whole school site by two or three meters because of existing sewage issues, we feel this is a very serious issue as it either affects the overall height of the school or the quality of the sewage system for the area.

I have concerns that the site is two small for all that is being asked of it with no room for expansion except onto the community ground. The new plans have the border hard up against all the surrounding property with no room for any unforeseen changes. I feel the planners have their own agenda and do not fully appreciate our concern. Therefore I ask that our points are looked at independently. I do appreciate that the school has to go somewhere but ask for consideration for the surroundings residents whose environment will be unrecognisable.







REF: OBJECTION TO THE PLANNING PERMISSION SOUGHT FOR THE ACCESS ROADS TO THE NEW COMMUNITY SCHOOL AT AVIEWORE.

I refer to the Notice served on us by the Highland Council Architects Section, Housing & Property, Town House, Inverness, which refers to the Planning permission sought for the construction of a new Community school and associated access roads at Aviemore, your ref HC JOB No. ECSC 0068. On behalf of the partnership at the Aviemore Medical Practice we would like to formally record our strong objection to the proposal for the access roads as indicated on the plan attached to your notice.

In principle we are more than happy to support the development of a new school in Aviemore, which we feel is long overdue. Although the building of the school on the proposed site behind the Health Centre will undoubtedly cause us major inconvenience in terms of noise, dust, pollution etc. during the construction, we feel this is a price worth paying for the benefit the community will derive from this new facility.

Nevertheless, we do have major concerns regarding the routing of the access road as proposed past the existing Ambulance station, Fire station and around the corner of our existing car park. This road as it currently stands is a very busy point of access at various times of the day. We are recognised as an A&E centre and regularly have ambulances attending our casualty facilities; our GP's all participate in the British Association of Immediate Care (BASICS) and as such also require unrestricted access in performing their duties. As mentioned previously, the fire and ambulance are positioned on this road as well and clear access is vital for all three life saving services.

Currently many parents use their cars to deliver and collect their children from school, this is evidenced by the Traffic Impact Assessment and the high density of traffic on Grampian Road; we are concerned that this high density traffic will be transferred to the new access road leading to the Health Centre and our car park. Given the limited parking available at the new school, it is inevitable that many children will be dropped off and picked up in our car park which would present a major safety hazard. We are also very concerned at large numbers of children walking down this road on and off the pavement (as children do) and the very real potential for an accident as a result.



We object strongly to the 'possible access road to Health Centre from the Civic Car Park' as shown on your attached plan. This has never been discussed, would further exacerbate all the safety issues outline above, would remove much of our current undersized car park and would completely negate any further development potential to our existing site. We would like to know what discussions have taken place with NHS Highland regarding this second access road. The map supplied with the notice needs to be extended to the North to show fully the access road proposed to the school from Grampian Road. We would ask that this be supplied.

We have maintained these objections throughout our discussions with the Highland Council, and would like to clarify exactly why no other alternative routes of access are being proposed. In particular we would like to ask why the purpose built road by the Glen Centre has not been examined fully. We understand that lines of sight can be established and that the width need not be a limiting factor.



I understand that your department has called in the plans for Aviemore Community School project,

While in total agreement that Aviemore urgently needs a new school, I have some objections to the plan, particularly to the proposed siting of the school.

Most of the properties on the boundaries of the site are one and two bedroom units and sheltered housing accommodation. This will result in nuisance from noise, dust etc., during construction, and noise from the completed school, and other facilities, disrupting the quality of life of elderly residents

The proposed new playing fields are to be located in a presently wooded area which is home to a vast amount of wildlife including deer, lizards and birds

Birch Road has the only vehicle access to the site and as such, residents have major concerns about their quiet cul de sac being turned into a convenient point of access for contractors during demolition of the woods

The Woods provide shelter from the elements, particularly wind, and in winter, snow and if this area is flattened. Birch Road will become intolerably exposed.



Tam...as with a number of Birch Road residents, annoyed at the high handedness of the highland council when it comes to planning/building of the new school...nothing to do with us I hear you say ...but...given the scale of the planning on this particular subject, I would imagine the highand council and indeed yourselves would want the backing of the community, rather than getting our backs up. I (along with 3 other families of Birch Road residents) went to the Aviemore library to see the plans when they were on display, armed with lots of questions, we spoke to an official...and as far as my questions were concerned there were quite a few 'grey' areas and 'our solicitors are looking into that'since that day a few of my concerns have been addressed by all most of the other residents who feel the same as myself...and we have been gatering our own information which highland council seem not to want us to know!!

Im insensed, i've lived in this lovely quiet street for years, moved here, had a family here, raised my children here, and had an active interest in the local issues like the new school, it beggars belief that whoever decides who should receive neighbour notification has decided in their wisdom that i at number 11 Birch Road dosent need one....er... have they actually visited the site? I can/will be able to see the new development from my back window and the playing fields from my front window, so i dont understand why they dont have the common decency to send any other neighbour notifications out to the rest of the

street apart from the one sent to number 12.(i know she has the only border to the site) ... everyone in the street should have got one ... give the HUGE amount of disruption we are all going to have to face during the construction period and all the vehicle/child traffic after the school is finished...this new development is going to hugely change our lives from now on ... if the highland council and the C.N.P.A took the time to walk round the site, and the streets close to the site... you will be able to see how much it is going to effect us. . as a matter of courtesey, maybe it would be a good thing to speak to the neighbouring houses, it's such a small street, a small village did they have to stick to the letter?...i realise you had the plans on display, but look where it got me !! I also understand that this issue has nothing to do with C.N.P.A but you have taken it over now and i want you to know that we at Birch Road are not happy guess thats the first stike against the Highland councili would imagine it would be favourable to have the community on your side.

Iam concerned, and therefore would like to object to the possible use of Birch Road as a point of access for construction/development traffic, due to the number of elderly residents, also we have 2 families with young children who play in the quiet no through street and woods, this would pose a danger for all of themplus the noise pollution for the rest of us.

The terrible desicration of our lovely Birch woods, poses other problemswe have some amazing wildlife in these woods.... 2 families of Roe deer, rabbits, all kinds of birds, lizards and more recently 2 RED SQUIRRELS!! So could you take that into consideration when planning the thickness of the treeband and wildlife corridor, being as dense as possible, this would incourage the wildlife back and also shelld us from noise from the playing fields/noise from the railway line and from the nasty weather i.e driving rain and snow, high winds etc.

Im also concerned about the only access route to the school, which passes the medical centre, fire station and ambulance depot... Highland council were very vague at the meeting i attended, so the impact of this point of access could have repercussions with regard to the emergency services being able (or not) to quickly exit their depots in the event of an emergency, during times when the school road would be busy... busses/deliveries/ and the road all clogged up with parents

driving their children to school etc....not an ideal situation im sure you will agree.

I decide to write you a more personal email....im sure you have all the formal objections...i just wanted the C.N.P.A to have an insight of the local families who have personal issues...we are going to be losing one of the only woodlands left in Aviemore, there are so many trees here now, by the looks of the plan, most of them are being pulled down.....but i would like you to consider planting more trees/shrubs in the treeban/wildlife corridor for reasons i stated above. Also im worried about the noise level from the construction.....from my back garden, the council has put a high fence up at the back of number 12....and also all the way pretty much round the houses that surround the football pitch, to stop noise pollution or help to keep it at a reasonable level, possibly you may deem it to be in keeping to add high fences to the back of my garden and that of my neighbours (no 10) as a good will gesture, as both of our houses back gardens overlook the construction site and the access point.

I would like it to be known that i think it is the wrong venue for the much needed new school, however as the site has been chosen, i and the other Birch Road residents believe it's in our best interests to make this as pleasant as possible for ourselves...here's hoping you will take into consideration the points i have made in this letter, and please do not hesitate to contact me if i can be involved in this planning at any stage, we love this area and would be only too pleased to meet with any persons from the C.N.P.A if they ever wanted to come and visit the site in person.

Aviemore New Primary School and Community Facilities

After viewing the proposed plan and following discussion with my neighbours, we would like to raise the following concerns for your attention.

- (i) As we understand it, the existing woodland bordered by Birch Road and the football pitch, is to be cleared for the new football pitch with a border of trees and shrubs to be planted alongside the road and the railway line as a wildlife corridor. These two areas seemed somewhat narrow on the proposed plan. As the local wildlife includes deer, we feel that these planted areas should be as wide and deep as possible. This would have the additional benefit of maximising water uptake and also continue to afford the residents some measure of wind protection and noise reduction from the new activities and the railway.
- (ii) Birch Road is a small, quiet cul-de-sac with a narrow entrance. Residents include both elderly persons and a number of young children. Obviously the woods would be off limits once work has begun, however, we do not believe that access for heavy vehicles via Birch Road would be safe for the residents and therefore request that works access be restricted to the turnings off Grampian Road.

- (iii) Loss of local facilities during the building of the new school and rearrangement of the woods, is of concern. We have not been able to establish whether alternative facilities are to be made available for-
 - (a) Landing for the Air Ambulance
 - (b) A football field

We would be grateful if you would clarify matters on these points.

(iv) The proposed new location of the school is likely to result in increased use of the footpaths to the north and east of the Royal British Legion site. These two rough paths are subject to poor drainage and flooding in wet weather. In the interests of the safety of children walking to the new school, may we request that all likely footpath routes are properly made with due attention to drainage.


