#### AGENDA ITEM 4: MINUTES & MATTERS ARISING FROM THE PREVIOUS MEETING

- 7. The minutes of the previous meeting, 15<sup>th</sup> October 2010, held at The Albert Hall, Ballater were approved.
- 8. Duncan Bryden advised Members that Fiona Munro, Housing Officer, had investigated the issue of purchasing public sector housing (raised in Paragraph 53, Minutes of 15<sup>th</sup> October 2010). Members had been circulated with a summary of the findings, which were:
  - Highland Council were contacted regarding their policy on purchasing public sector housing. Normally the policy is to purchase as long as the property is value for money and there are funds available to do so. Unfortunately, in this instance the costs of purchase and renovation were too high and the Highland Council made the decision not to purchase.
  - The 5 Local Authority policies were checked on purchasing public sector housing in case they had changed in the current economic climate.
  - Fiona Munro will raise the issue at the next Housing Delivery Team meeting to ensure the Local Authorities are aware that CNPA is supportive of this type of house purchase for affordable rented housing or low cost home ownership opportunities.

#### 24. 10/359/CP - Marcus Humphrey declared an interest and left the room. The decision was to call-in the application for the following reason :

• The proposed development involves the extension of a car park into an existing woodland area at a recognised tourist facility. The subject site is within an area which is the subject of several natural heritage designations, including being within the Muir of Dinnet National Nature Reserve and the Muir of Dinnet Site of Special Scientific Interest. The proposal raises issues of significance to the aims of the national park, particularly in terms of the conservation and enhancement of the natural heritage of the area, promoting the enjoyment and understanding of the special qualities of the area by the general public, and also the social and economic development of the area.
