





KEY POINTS :


- Planning permission is sought at Glenbuchat Hall for the formation of a disabled access ramp;
- The ramp would extend from the side of the building, to the rear, where it would lead directly to the door of the rear entrance vestibule;
- The proposal is of a minor nature and would improve access to the hall for a wide variety of user groups. It is not considered to raise issues of significance to the aims of the National Park.



Applicant(s) :Candacraig EstateProposal :Extension to agricultural building




KEY POINTS :

- Planning permission is sought for an extension to an agricultural building at Ledmacoy, Strathdon;
- The existing building is part of a group of farmyard buildings and is a standard construction with the walls consisting of rendered blockwork and steel sheeting, with fibre cement sheeting on the roof;
- The extension is proposed to the side of the existing structure and would have the same finishes;
- The development is a minor addition within the existing agricultural yard and is not considered to raise issues of significance to the aims of the National Park.
