TRAINING AND SKILLS DEVELOPMENT

We can support land based businesses acquire and improve **relevant and necessary skills** by coordinating and assisting with funding, along with partners, for training in:

- key rural skills, eg chainsaw certificate, quad-bike use, safe use of pesticides
- businesses development and diversification, eg renewables
- conservation skills, eg habitat restoration, surveying and monitoring
- competence, eg best practice in forestry and deer management
- health and safety, eg first aid in remote locations
