

Anns a' chìad Phlana Pàirc Nàiseanta seo tha sinn den bheachd gum bu chòir dhuinn uile a bhith a' coimhead romhainn le co-mhothachadh air adhbhar. Le bhith ag obair còmhla tha e comasach dhuinn ar sealladh àrd airson na Pàirce Nàiseanta san àm ri teachd a choileanadh. Bidh Pàirc Nàiseanta a' Mhonaidh Ruaidh sàr-ire na fior bhuannachd dha na daoine a tha a' fuireach agus ag obair san sgire agus gu dearbh do dhaoine air feadh Alba agus an dùthchannan eile – ach iarradh seo dòigh-obrach ùr airson rianachd na Pàirce.
