

ARE YOU GETTING THE MOST FROM YOUR GRASS?

The Cairngorms National Park Authority, in association with the Cairngorms Farmers' Forum, is working in conjunction with the Scottish Agricultural College to offer a course for land-based businesses within/partly within the Cairngorms National Park. It will take place at:

Tuesday 25 September 2012, 13.00 to 16.30 Tullochgorum Farm, Boat of Garten

A soil sample will be required before the event to have it analysed and the individual written results will be available on the day – once you register for the course you will be told where to deposit the sample prior to the event. There will be a nominal fee of £10 for analysis of your sample. The soil sample will be required to be with us by Friday 31 August.

The course will be run by Jenny McCallum and will cover:

Soil Good Foundation

- The value of soil analysis look at attendees sample results
- Soil structure handle different samples and discuss why they need treated differently
- (Sub soiling and drainage machinery demo?)
- Fertiliser and trace elements what and when to apply and how to cut costs

Grass

- Do you know your improved from your unimproved? how to recognise the value of the sward
- Clover red, white, wild, large and small? which, why and when?
- How to manage semi natural grassland
- Re-seeding techniques pros and cons
- Cutting and grazing management could you:
 - Increase stocking rate
 - Take less seasonal grazing
 - Increase output
 - Cut purchased feed costs
