Introduction

The Proposed Local Development Plan (the Plan) sets out a strategy for future development in the National Park. It includes sites and proposals for development as well as the policies that will be used to make decisions on applications for planning permission. We aim to formally adopt the Plan in 2020 when the current Local Development Plan 2015 comes to an end. The Plan focuses on the five year period until 2025. It also includes development proposals for the 10 year period until 2030, as well as providing a general indication of the likely scale and location of development as far as 20 years into the future.

Subject: Local Development Plan 2020 - Ballater

I am writing as a follow up to your almost unannounced visit, or so called Drop in Event, to Ballater on the 19 February 2019, where we heard yet again that you are resurrecting the large scale housing development previously proposed in 2009, on basically the same site, specified as H1.

Having read the Hardcopy Local Development Plan, which I note did not include the Strategic Flood Assessment Map for Ballater and laboured through the various websites and the all too numerous attachments, designed to deter any lay person like myself from contributing, I hereby lodge the undermentioned objections to the plan viz:

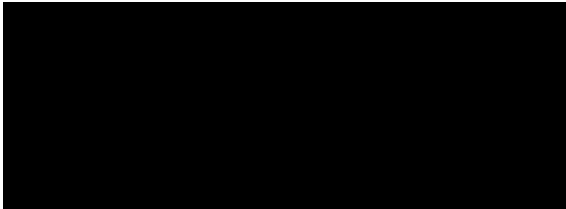
- The adoption of this plan and the building of up to 250 houses would result in a complete visual blight on the perfect landscape and the view of the Strath coming from Tullich, which has been captured by many well renowned artists over the years. It should be recognised that Ballater is unique, being a combination of countryside, village and mountains (Lochnagar) which is without doubt outstanding and would be severely spoilt by this Proposal for a sprawling housing estate.
- The proposal fails to meet your Policy Statement on New Housing whereby it states "it should reinforce or enhance the character of the settlement". This proposed large scale development on the East of the village will appear as a total eyesore to the entrance of the village and can in no way be viewed as "enhancing the character" of Ballater.
- The Strategic Flood Risk Assessment report understates the likely risk of flooding to the site of H1, particularly if the Climate Change factor of 20% (Section 8 of the Report) is taken in to account. The extent of River flooding shown in the Strategic Flood Assessment Diagram miraculously stops on the edge of H1 on the Old Railway Line. This I suggest is wishful thinking on your part and does not fully reflect what happened when Storm Frank hit in December 2015.

I am all in favour of ensuring provision is made for an adequate number of low cost housing for local people, but this does not have to be at the expense of spoiling Ballater as a tourist attraction, which is my contention will result if you proceed with your plan. Surely after ten years having elapsed from your last submission in 2009, you must be capable of coming up with a better and substantially different plan than before. It would seem to me that you are devoid of fresh ideas and perhaps you

should properly consult, at an Open Meeting, the Community and LISTEN to their views as against imposing your unwanted scheme.

Finally, I would suggest that when, not if, there is a repeat of the 2015 Flooding and parts of H1 are flooded the CNPA will be clearly held responsible for pressing ahead with this proposal against all common sense. It will be interesting to see who within the Planning Department will be held accountable.
